In 1848 several hundred people gathered together to hold the first ever Political Convention for women in the United States, creating a pathway for women to enter into politics. Several years later, the first female was elected to serve in public office: Mayor Susanna (Kinsey) Salter. Ever since then, we've been campaigning and governing with ease. Or have we?

Let's ask some of our local elected leaders what it is REALLY like to campaign for and serve in public office as a woman. County District Clerk Melisa Miller, Presiding Judge of Country Court at Law 3 Amy Tucker, and County Court at Law 6 Presiding Judge Scharlene Valdez will all share their experiences during a fireside chat style interview. They will discuss topics such as barriers to entry, campaign logistics, the Republican Party, surprising impediments, and joyful triumphs.

MINUTES OF THE JANUARY 8 MEETING

The meeting was called to order by Tammy Coleman, President, at 11:00 a.m. on February 5, 2024, at the Bentwater Country Club. Chaplain, Christy Mendelow, inspired us with her devotional on “love”, during this Valentine month. Commissioner Robert Walker led the pledges to the American and Texas flags. The minutes were accepted as presented.

Genette Stanton gave the Membership report for 2nd VP, Kathleen Stern. She reported that our Member event at the lovely home of Carolyn Jones was a huge success. Many new memberships were obtained. Currently our active membership is 130 and associate membership is twenty. Deborah Graham, 3rd Vice-President, reported on the status of our Fundraiser Golf Tournament to be held on September 30. Committees have been formed. Ron Keyser, owner of Guadalaharry’s Bar and Grill, and Commissioner Robert Walker have already made commitments for sponsorships. The following themes have been suggested: Promises Made, Promises Kept, Change – Moving Forward, The Trump Train, We Won, But We’ve Only Begun”. Chris Gurley, Treasurer, presented the report for the month of January. Our balance is \$58,314.15.

Genette Stanton, Campaign Activities Chairman, asked that each member send their campaign hours to her for her report. Sarah Henry, Legislative Chairman, reported that the 89th Legislative Session convened on January 15. On this day, the Legislature took their oath of office with family and friends present. The House Elected conservative Republican, Dustin Burrows, from Lubbock as Speaker of the house and took action to ban Democrat committee chairs in the House rules package. Our State Senator, SD4, was named President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and served as Governor, while our Governor and Lt. Governor attended the Inauguration of President Trump. On February 2, Governor Abbott gave his State of State Address, and listed seven Emergency Items for Legislative Session: Property Tax Relief, Teacher Pay Raises, School Choice, Career and Technical Education Expansion, Bail Reform, Texas Cyber Command, Investment in Water Infrastructure.

Ms. Henry also encouraged attendance to the 2025 TFRW Legislative Day, to be held on March 20-21, at the AT & T Hotel and Conference Center. Deadline for registration is March 15. Please consider attending this exciting event. Dorothy Woodall moved that President Tammy Coleman be added to the NSRW bank account at Woodforest National Bank, as a signee. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously. Dorothy Woodall moved that Immediate Past President, Leigh Billingsley, be removed as a signee to the NSRW bank account at Woodforest National Bank. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

The following Elected Officials were introduced: Megan Metcalf, representing Representative Will Metcalf; Judge Kent Chambers, 9th Court of Criminal Appeal; Judge Tracy Gilbert 418th District Court; Commissioner Robert Walker, Pct.1; Gwen Writhrow, Chairman, Montgomery County Republican Party, and Ann Kate, Precinct Chair #72. President Coleman expressed sincere thanks to Judge Gilbert for his gift of red roses to each person present.

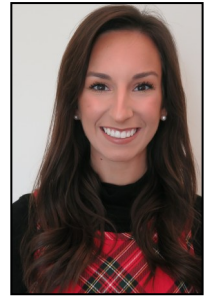

It is an honor to serve the people of House District 16 and Montgomery County, and I am excited to share an update about my recent committee assignments for the 89th Texas Legislature. As your State Representative, I remain committed to upholding the conservative values that make Texas strong. At the beginning of this session, I was proud to vote to ban Democrat committee chairs on all standing committees. Every standing House committee will be chaired by a Republican, and all standing committees and subcommittees are comprised of Republican majorities. My appointments for this session enable me to advocate for policies that directly impact our state's economy, culture, and future to ensure that we keep Texas great.

Out of 150 State Representatives across our great state, I am honored to be one of 30 State Representatives to lead a standing committee this session. I am humbled to have been appointed as **Chairman of the House Committee on Culture, Recreation, and Tourism**. I will also continue serving on the **State Affairs Committee** and as **Vice-Chair of the Permanent Standing Subcommittee on Telecommunications and Broadband**. All these appointments play a part in developing important policies that affect our state and everyday life for families in our community.

I've always fought to ensure that our natural landscapes and resources are preserved, our history is honored, and our tourism industry continues to thrive, contributing to economic growth and job creation. As a sixth generation Texan, I know how special Texas is and the need to continually defend and promote our way of life. The Culture, Recreation, and Tourism Committee holds jurisdiction over matters that are central to our state's identity and economic prosperity. Our committee is tasked with promoting and preserving Texas' rich history, including the preservation and protection of our shrines, monuments and memorials. We will also oversee the Texas Historical Commission, the Texas Commission on the Arts, and the State Preservation Board, which I have served on as a board member since 2021. Additionally, the committee also has jurisdiction over the Texas Bicentennial Commission, which will plan and oversee the state's 2036 bicentennial celebration to celebrate our great state's 200th birthday. This is an exciting celebration that I am honored to be able to play a role in as a native Texan whose family arrived here in the 1840's.

Our committee also regulates recreational activities and activities related to wildlife, including hunting and fishing, which are cherished traditions in Texas - and traditions that I personally hold dear. The committee oversees the management and development of our state parks, ensuring they remain accessible and well-maintained for the public to enjoy and has oversight over the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

Another key aspect of my role as Chairman of this committee is enhancing Texas' image and heritage to attract visitors from around the world. Tourism is a significant economic driver for our state budget, supporting local businesses and creating jobs across the state. Our committee will help provide oversight to the Texas Economic Development and Tourism Office and ensure we develop smart common-sense policies to advance economic development and international and interstate tourism. This leadership appointment is especially meaningful to me as Montgomery County is rich with cultural and recreational activities, including Lake Conroe, the Sam Houston National Forest, W.G. Jones State Forest, as well as many hunting and fishing experiences and festivals that come to our community. I am proud to serve as Chairman of this committee and look forward to the work we will do to preserve our Texas way of life.

I am honored to once again serve on the Committee on State Affairs. The Committee on State Affairs is a powerful committee with very broad jurisdiction over a wide array of matters, including any issues of importance deemed relevant to state policy, the powers of state government and all of its departments, agencies, and institutions, the conduct of persons with influence in public policy, the regulation of electric, telecommunications and cybersecurity utilities, and an all-encompassing range of issues where jurisdiction is not granted to another standing committee under the Texas House rules. This committee's wide-ranging authority enables us to tackle significant policy matters that affect the daily lives of Texans and will allow me to ensure you have a strong conservative voice in the policies and functions of our state.

The State of Texas has long been a shining example of how all states in our union should function. This is evidenced by over 1,000 new Texans moving here each day, and the number of businesses moving their headquarters to our great state. We have seen our state's low regulation, business-friendly policy framework thriving as companies from all over the nation leave their heavy-handed governments behind to move to Texas where economic promise flourishes. I am proud to once again serve on this important committee, and it is one of my top priorities as a member to see that Texas continues to lead

I am also honored to be appointed as Vice-Chair of the Permanent Standing Subcommittee on Telecommunications and Broadband. Last session, the Texas legislature made the largest investment for broadband expansion in state history with a historic \$1.5 billion allocated to a new infrastructure fund. We will continue to work to improve internet connectivity across Texas, since reliable broadband is crucial for education, healthcare, and economic development in our modern world. We plan to continue to support the development of strong telecommunications networks so that all Texans have access to essential communication services, especially where it must be improved to meet public safety needs.

In each of these leadership roles, my commitment is to serve with integrity, uphold our shared conservative values and principles, and work tirelessly for the betterment of Montgomery County residents and state. I look forward to the work we will do this session to keep Texas great.

May God bless you, your family, and the great State of Texas.



Senator Brandon Creighton Authors Education Bills

Among the several bills authored and filed by Senate District 4 Senator Brandon Creighton during this 89th Session are two recent ones concerning education.

SB2 “Texas Education Freedom Act” - From Senator Creighton’s website: Once enacted, Senate Bill 2 would establish the largest day-one launch of a school choice program in the nation. The program is designed to serve 100,000 Texas students, with priority given to low-income and special needs students. The bill also includes strong safeguards to prevent fraud and protect Texas taxpayers, ensuring that funds are used responsibly while maximizing opportunities for students.

“The status quo is failing too many Texas families, and parents are demanding change. SB 2 delivers that change, ensuring every child has a path to academic success,” said Creighton. “This bill is about unleashing the potential of every student—no matter their zip code or background.”

SB26 - “Texas Teacher Bill of Rights” - From Senator Creighton’s Facebook page: “Today I filed the first bill in my Texas Teacher Bill of Rights legislative package. SB 26 invests nearly \$5 billion directly to teacher compensation. This is historic and unprecedented--no state has ever made an investment this bold that goes directly to permanent classroom teachers raises. The bill also includes free pre-k for teachers’ children and liability protections. Much more to come this session that affirms our commitment to Texas educators”.
