Rebecca Smith is a Licensed Professional Counselor and Supervisor. She is also trained as a Parent Facilitator/Parent Coordinator and Mediator. Rebecca facilitates workshops and training programs on various topics related to high conflict divorce and custody modification across the nation. Rebecca graduated with Honors from Southwest Texas State University. After her Bachelor's, Rebecca moved to Huntsville and graduated with Honors from Sam Houston State University with a Masters of Arts in Counseling. Immediately following her Master's program, Rebecca attended the PhD program in Counseling for 5 semesters. Rebecca has been working with children since 1998 and has been in the mental health field since 2003.

Rebecca recognized the profound need to expand her philanthropy work and founded the nonprofit, Love Heals You. Serving foster youth at no cost is an endeavor she started in 2008, but when she became aware of the child welfare crisis, she knew she had to do more. Understanding how love is incredibly transformative, it was inevitable that Love Heals must be the focus for the nonprofit.

Treasurer's Report - Chris Gurley, PAC Treasurer



We began the month of December with a balance forward of \$119,750. We brought in income of \$3,240 (Community Engagement Alliance for

New Americans \$523, Dues \$2,413, Gift Table \$304). Expenditures totaled \$6,841. (Administrative \$567, Americanism \$1,750, Caring & Concern \$66, Communications/Media \$343, Community Engagement \$1,155, NFRW Convention \$750, Historian \$5, Hospitality \$50, Membership Recruitment \$28, Membership Dues to TFRW \$1,745, Publicity \$100, Special Events (Christmas) \$232, Ways & Means (Gift Table) \$50. Our balance on hand as of December 31, 2023 was \$116,149.

I have received thank you cards from the pregnancy centers we were able to help in 2023 by providing diapers, wipes, pacifiers, baby bath and baby lotion. The price of all these items has gone up and more women are



MINUTES OF THE JANUARY 3 MEETING - Mary Osborn, Recording Secretary

The January General Meeting of North Shore Republican Women was called to order by President Leigh Billingsley at 11:00 AM.

Genette Stanton, 2nd Vice President reported on the membership statistics and the ability to register and pay online. Chris Gurley, Treasurer, presented the monthly report, with the balance on hand at the end of December to be \$116,148.74.

Ann South, the Caring for America chairman spoke of the help we have given to the pregnancy centers in the Montgomery County area. She introduced Teresa Strack who gave an update on the Life First program. Deborah Gentz, chairman for the Campaign Activities chair gave an update on the Candidate Forum to be held on January 30 from 5 to 8 at the North Montgomery County Community Center in Willis. She also asked members to relay their volunteer hours to her as soon as possible, since they are due by January 10th. Gail McKinnon, Historian, presented a beautiful scrap book to Leigh Billingsley for 2023. Ann Kate, Media committee chair, spoke about the need for a member to step up to learn the position responsibilities. Karen Darcy-Pawlak, the Community Engagement chair, gave a report about the need for volunteer voter registrars and to ask for volunteers to teach the Hispanic community in the Alliance of New Americans organization. A birthday greeting was given to Cay Eckland from Leigh Billingsley.


The meeting was adjourned at 1:00 pm.
